### WELSH DESSERT AND CULINARY APPLES:

(Not necessarily disease-resistant, but usually pretty good)

<i>Bakers Delicious</i>	-	early eater found in South Wales hedgerow
<i>Bardsey apple</i>	-	excellent eater from the island of that name
<i>Brith Mawr</i>	-	mid-season eater, Newport
<i>Channel Beauty</i>	-	mid-season eater. Cox seedling from Swansea
<i>Cissy</i>	-	second early eater from Malpas, Newport
<i>Welsh Pitcher</i>	-	early, light yellow eater from Talgarth, Powys
<i>Gelli Aur Cooker</i>	-	late cooker from original planting of Gelli Aur Mansion (Triploid)
<i>Kenneth</i>	-	eater from North Wales
<i>Leathercoat</i>	-	very late russet from Dinefwr = Flower of the West
<i>Machen</i>	-	second early red dual purpose from Chepstow area
<i>Marged (Morgan) Nicolas</i>	-	dual purpose from Dinefwr
<i>Monmouth Green (Landore)</i>	-	Multi-purpose. Monmouth to Brecon = Underleaf
<i>Morgan Sweet</i>	-	adopted early eater/cider, once common in South Wales
<i>North Pembs. Russet</i>	-	late eater from Newport, Pembs.
<i>Pen Caled</i>	-	mid-season cooker from St. Dogmaels, Cardiganshire
<i>Pig Aderyn</i>	-	mid-season general purpose variety – tasty, light cider
<i>Pig yr Wydd</i>	-	mid-season cooker from Llanwrda
<i>Pren Glas</i>	-	early eater from St. Dogmaels, Cardiganshire
<i>St. Cecilia</i>	-	mid-season eater from Bassaleg, Newport (Cox seedling)
<i>Tinyrwydd</i>	-	early cooker from Llangadog = Lord Grosvenor
<i>Wern</i>	-	Late cooker from Tenby, Pembrokeshire = Scotch Bridget

**A LIST OF RECOMMENDED EATING AND COOKING PEARS:**

<i>Beth</i> (3)	... early eater – like Williams but smaller. Does not keep.
<i>Concorde</i> (4)	... mid-season eater – better flavour than Conference.
<i>Conference</i> (4)	... mid-season dual purpose
<i>Pitmasten Duchess</i> (4)	... mid-season dual purpose – a little 'grainy' as an eater
<i>Winter Nelis</i> (4)	... very late eater – superb flavour. Eat in Dec.

**SUGGESTED PLUMS, DAMSONS, GAGES etc:**

<i>Victoria plum</i> (3 sf)	... mid-season dual purpose	We get these from a quality wholesaler.
<i>Opal</i> (3 sf)	... mid-season eater	
<i>Merryweather damson</i> (2 sf)	... mid-season cooker	All are grafted onto semi-vigorous St. Julian A or the dwarf VVA1 rootstocks.
<i>Shropshire prune damson</i> (3 sf)	... mid-season cooker	
<i>Cambridge gage</i> (3 sf)	... mid-season eater	
<i>Stella cherry</i> (sf)	... mid-season eater	
<i>Lapin's cherokee</i> (sf)	... early eater	
<i>Morello cherry</i> (sf)	... cooker	We have many other unusual apple varieties in pots and what we don't have we can usually order or graft especially for you.
<i>Quince – Serbian Gold</i> (sf)	... resistant to leaf blight
